SECURITY POLICY

There is ever increasing threat to ships' security, whether it be from theft, stowaways, piracy, terrorism, bomb threats or drug smuggling. The security of the ship is important to all those involved in its operation, from the Company to the crew members. It is important that practical steps are taken to lessen the risks.

It is Songa Shipmanagement Ltd policy therefore to maintain and improve security on board all vessels. A Ship Security Plan (SSP) has been designed for all vessels in the fleet. Using the SSP as a basis the company will promote Security through training and drills, company policy and a commitment from all levels. All Songa Shipmanagement Ltd personnel shall adhere to this policy and will identify to appropriate supervisory levels any situations which breach this policy.

Basic factors involved in the promotion of security and included in the SSP include:

- Company Security Officer (CSO)
- Ship Security Officer (SSO)
- Physical Security Standards i.e. access to vessel and use of restricted areas
- Maritime Security Levels
- Communications
- General Anti-Terrorism Awareness
- Training and Drill Policy
- Documentation and Records
